Journey of the People of God

“Let the Journey begin!” the newsletter announced last month. The Missional Journey Coordinating Team (MJCT) has been learning and planning together. This June/July article to all of FPC is an MJCT update, but more than that, an invitation! Our congregation has decided to take a FAMILY trip. In most families, there are times when a parent goes out of town on a trip; children go on trips to camp, to visit, to study elsewhere. Each trip, every time, takes planning. Family trips take the most planning of all – everyone gives input and listens to others. Consensus is reached. Finally, all work together to make that journey a happy reality. The whole church family is NEEDED to plan and then take this wonderful trip.

Last fall, our Session committed to a process in which numerous other congregations from our Presbytery are also engaged. “Journey of the People of God” is a detailed progression of steps that many congregations have already successfully traveled. Since last fall, FPC’s Coordinating Team has been formed and an outside coach assigned. Workshops have been attended and initial planning done. The destination, however, is not yet known! That will be a decision for the whole family to make! The general direction, however, is set by the Head of the family, Christ. Christ is our compass. His mission is our mission. And so, over the next several months, through an effective and proven process, we will all want to engage in this first phase of **DISCOVERING** why we need to journey. Later, we will **DISCERN** together what the actual destination is to be and plot our route. Lastly, we will set about to **DO** the mission we will have developed, together, as the family of First Presbyterian Church, Mishawaka.

We are excited to share the next steps with all of you.

September/October - September 12 (Sunday) – a special “Kick-Off” where we will worship, eat together, hold a “Conference on the Past” to choose what we want to take with us on our journey from our rich history. Everyone will be asked to sign-up for six weeks of small group events involving fellowship, journey discussion, and Bible encounters. A variety of Sunday and weekday meeting times will be offered. (child care provided)

November - a four-week emphasis during worship on particular aspects of Christ’s mission for us

January 23 (Sunday) - Annual Congregational Meeting, meal, “Conference on the Present,” sharing of next steps to be taken.

From the Finance Committee: Offering Envelopes

Since New Year's, the hundred and fifty boxes of offering envelopes that were custom printed for our membership have been used in many different ways. Some households faithfully use every envelope. Some use one per month, and throw the rest away. There are four households who don't use them at all, but rather direct their banker or broker to send a contribution monthly, annually, or something in between. The church can't survive without the stewards, and whatever way works best for the donors is just fine. What follows is not intended to stress anyone's orderly way of supporting their church.

Some long-time members have been considering the envelopes recently. One made the observation that watching the collection plate go around the sanctuary can be interesting. The first Sunday of the month, many envelopes go in. Later in the month, just a few. As our attendance drops, it becomes more noticeable. Observation led to some wonder, "What do the guests think? Do those people who are church shopping, sitting in the back, notice the near-empty collection plate coming around? Does that alter their perception of our congregation?"

An informal poll of the finance committee found that most of the committee members had been making their payments once per month. Two of us, though, have begun trying to use every envelope. This could be as simple as writing that one monthly check, and then putting a single dollar (or more) in the other envelopes, and being a participant in the offering every week.

We invite you to consider being a weekly participant in the offering, Help set an example, a tone of giving. You don't have to change your giving pattern to play along.

Please remember, too, as summer approaches, church expenses continue while members travel!

From Nominating Committee:

The Nominating Committee has begun its work which will be challenging (we have 14 positions to fill) but rewarding. We are asking the congregation's help with suggesting names for the three boards for the 2011-2013 term. The Nominating Committee always seeks a balance of representatives from the congregation as directed by the Book of Order. We are looking for all ages, experience, talents and gender.

For the election this Fall, we are needing the following positions filled: 4 Deacons, 3 Trustees and 3 Elders for Session. We also have to fill 5 positions on the Nominating Committee. The Deacons and Trustee assignments are worked out when those boards meet in the new year, but the Nominating Committee has the responsibility to fill the Session Chairs. This year we are looking for Chairs of Stewardship, C.E. and Mission.

These are extremely important positions as our church works to bring in new members, improve our existing programs and develop new ones. We are asking you to give careful and prayerful consideration as to whom these nominees should be. You are invited to express your interest as well. Every name you submit will be given careful consideration as we try to establish the balance needed for these boards.
